



- Identify requirements for skills development and training needs




SaferAfrica Objectives

 Create favorable conditions and opportunities for the effective implementation of actions for road safety and traffic management in African countries, by setting up a Dialogue Platform between Africa and Europe

Dialogue Platform: Technical/Operative Level

- Support the assessment of the implementation of African Road Safety Action Plan 2011–2020
- Support the definition of possible initiatives to foster the implementation of the Action Plan
- Prepare projects "keys in hand" for the Dialogue Platform Management Board

Initiatives / Working Groups will address:

- road safety policies
- road safety and traffic management
- capacity building and training and other road safety interventions

Different scales: countries, corridors, regions, continent



Dialogue Platform (DP): Decision-making Level

- Define recommendations on future road safety actions and conduct institutional activities to foster their adoption
- Define the needs for promoting the setup of professional networks
- Promote Twinning Programs and other road safety initiatives, which must be properly funded
- Widen the network through the involvement of additional stakeholders
