A participative web portal where African stakeholders can find specialized information on road safety, such as: country factsheets, capacity review reports, good practices, webinars.


It will now become the knowledge hub and portal of the Africa Regional Road Safety Observatory (ARSO) managed by the African Union

### **Road safety projects**

- 5 Road Safety Management Capacity Reviews have been undertaken in 5 African Countries (Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Kenya, South Africa and Tunisia)
- Specific proposals remedial and sustainable actions were discussed within workshops.
- Detailed short-term improvement plans in the form of Terms of Reference for several projects per selected country
- Recommendations and most promising improvement opportunities for road design standards and standards for vehicles' production, import and inspection standards



### **Capacity building**

- A complete **road safety e-learning course** with more than **800** minutes distributed in **36** lessons freely available on the African RSO
- A **Train The Trainer manual** to support lecturers who wish to incorporate a course on road safety into the curriculum of another educational program.
- A **Twinning project** between the *Research Centre for Transport and Logistics of Sapienza University* (Italy) and the *Ecole Nationale Superieure de Travaux Publics* (Cameroon) was set up from February to June 2019 to facilitate and to improve the academic, scientific and research activities in Cameroon.
