

# E-Survey of Road Users' Attitudes - ESRA

- A joint international initiative of research organisations and road safety institutes coordinated by Vias institute, and the acronym stands for E-Survey of Road Users' Attitudes.
- An extensive survey undertaken with a representative sample of the adult population in participating countries (using online access panels), carried out in 68 participating countries and covering 6 continents.

# The 20-min survey addresses over 300 items, focusing on 5 topics:

- Speeding
- DUI
- Distraction
- Seatbelt
- Fatigue

## 5 target road users groups:

- Car drivers
- PTW riders
- Cyclists
- Pedestrian






















# Aim and Objectives

- Provide scientific support for road safety policy making at national and international levels.
- Make internationally comparable data available on the current road safety situation in countries all over the world.
- Develop a series of reliable, cost-effective and comparable road safety performance indicators.
- Develop time series on road safety performance.



#### 2015

The first ESRA is launched, gathering 23 partners and 25 participating countries. Collection of data was carried out between 2015 and 2017.

### 2018

ESRA 2 is launched in 2018 with 32 countries, followed by a second wave with 16 new participating countries in 2019.

### 10 Road Safety Themes:

- Use of different transport modes
- Self-declared safe and unsafe behaviour in traffic
- Acceptability of safe and unsafe traffic behaviour
- Attitudes towards safe and unsafe traffic behaviour
- Involvement in road crashes
- Subjective safety and risk perception
- Support for policy measures
- Opinions and experiences with enforcement measures
- Infrastructure
- Specific regional questions



#### 2023

ESRA 3 is launched in 2023 with 39 countries. All country fact sheets are available on the website.
