## Greek Road Traffic Code for Bicycles

Bicycles use bike lanes, when available.

Otherwise, riders are required to use the right side of the road, except for highways and expressways, where bicycles are not allowed to circulate.



 Cyclists under the age of 12 must be accompanied by persons aged 16 and over.  Cyclists aged 12 and over are required to carry a legal identification document.

## **GENERAL RULES:**

- Riders are obliged to hold the steering wheel with both hands, except for when they use hand signals.
- It is not allowed to ride side by side with other bicycles.
- It is forbidden to carry extra passengers, except for when there is an additional child seat.
- It is prohibited to use headphones or mobile phones, while riding. Audio devices and mobile phones are only allowed with a hands-free kit.
- Cyclists are required to comply with the general or specific for them (if any) road signs and traffic signals.
- To avoid obstacles or danger, cyclists should walk their bicycles on sidewalks.

## **EQUIPMENT:**

- Helmet use is recommended.
- At night, riders who use bicycles for the transport of goods are required to wear reflective clothing or equipment.
- Bicycles are required to be equipped with one bell, one white or yellow light at the front of the bike and one red reflective light at the rear. Road and mountain bikes are excluded, as long as they do not circulate at night.
- Electrically assisted bicycles, which move independently (without pedal use) at speeds higher than 6 km/h, are considered as mopeds and follow mopeds' traffic rules (e.g. driving license, license plate, vehicle insurance, helmet, etc.)
